Data or Specimens Only Research

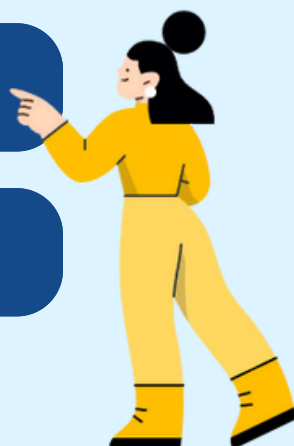

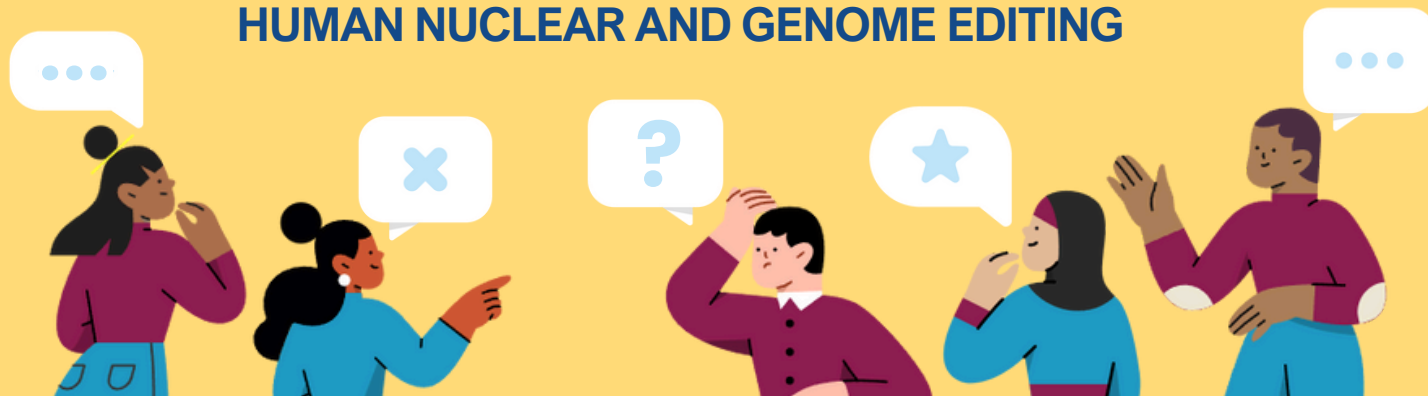

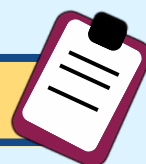
ON ETHICAL, LEGAL, AND SOCIAL ISSUES ARISING FROM
